TRI-COUNTY COALITION JOINS NATIONWIDE DAY OF PEACEFUL ACTION

DETROIT, March 10, 2026 – On March 28, something powerful is happening across the country. Hundreds of thousands of people will take to the streets – peacefully, proudly, and united – as part of the national No Kings movement. Nine events in Detroit and surrounding communities will be organized by a coalition of Indivisible groups and Detroit area partners giving teachers, factory workers, parents, students, and retirees the chance to speak their minds.

The “No Kings” rallies are a direct response to what organizers describe as an alarming accumulation of unchecked power at the highest levels of government. Participants are calling for transparency, the rule of law, and a reaffirmation that in America, sovereignty rests with the people – not any individual.

“When hardworking people struggle to make ends meet while power concentrates at the top, when our neighbors are targeted because of the color of their skin, and when our sons and daughters are sent into conflict without honesty or transparency, that is not a policy disagreement – that is broken promises,” said Detroit organizer Audrey Bourriaud. “We are gathering in the streets on March 28 because we love our country, but the moment we stop holding power to account is the moment we hand it away.”

Organizers are committed to nonviolent, lawful demonstration in the tradition of American civic protest. Families and first-time demonstrators are warmly encouraged to attend.

EVENT OVERVIEW

DATE: March 28, 2026

START TIME: 3 PM

LOCATION: Grand Circus Park (101 Witherell Street, Detroit, MI 48226)

ROUTE: Participants will gather at Grand Circus Park before marching down Woodward Avenue. The full route will not be publicly disclosed in advance for safety reasons.

EXPECTED ATTENDANCE: Thousands of participants from across Southeast Michigan.

ORGANIZED BY: A coalition of grassroots organizations, community groups, labor unions, civil rights organizations, and local activists from across Metro Detroit. See nokingsdetroit.org/organizations for the most up-to-date list of organizers and endorsers.

PURPOSE OF THE DEMONSTRATION

No Kings Detroit is part of a nationwide day of action bringing communities together to **defend American democracy** and **reject authoritarian rule**. The name “No Kings” reflects a simple principle at the heart of American democracy: political power belongs to the people, not to any individual leader. Across the country, millions of people have taken part in No Kings demonstrations to **oppose growing threats to democratic norms, civil rights, and constitutional accountability**.

In Detroit, participants will gather to demand **government accountability, protection of voting rights, and the defense of civil liberties**, among other things. Organizers are also calling for **no ICE/CBP raids or federal troops on Detroit’s streets**, arguing that militarized federal enforcement and immigration crackdowns threaten community safety, democratic freedoms, and trust. Demonstrators are also demanding the **impeachment, conviction, and removal of President Donald Trump**, citing abuses of executive authority and ongoing threats to the rule of law and American democracy itself.



Like all No Kings events, the Detroit demonstration is grounded in a commitment to **peaceful, nonviolent civic engagement** and the belief that **public participation is essential when democracy is under attack**. The mobilization is intended to channel public concern into visible, collective action in defense of democracy and the promise of the American dream.

ABOUT NO KINGS DETROIT

No Kings Detroit is a coalition-led grassroots mobilization bringing together organizations and residents from across Southeast Michigan to oppose the authoritarian actions of the Trump regime and defend democratic institutions.

The March 28 demonstration is part of a nationwide wave of No Kings protests organized in response to Donald Trump's second presidency. The movement takes its name from a core democratic principle: in the United States, political power belongs to the people, not to any single leader.

Across the country, communities are mobilizing to push back against escalating abuses of executive power, attacks on civil liberties, and the erosion of constitutional norms under the Trump regime.

A COALITION ACROSS MICHIGAN AND BEYOND

No Kings Detroit is organized by a broad coalition of local, statewide, and national organizations working together. The coalition includes grassroots organizations rooted in Detroit communities, statewide organizations operating across Michigan, and national organizations that maintain organizing networks in Southeast Michigan.

Participating organizations represent a wide range of movements and issue areas, including:

- anti-fascism
- democracy reform and voting rights
- campaign finance reform and anti-corruption
- civil rights and racial justice
- labor organizing
- immigrant rights
- environmental protection
- reproductive rights
- economic justice

The coalition reflects growing alignment among groups that may focus on different issues but share a common concern about the direction of the country under the Trump regime. A full list of coalition members is available at nokingsdetroit.org/organizations.



WHY THIS MOBILIZATION IS HAPPENING

The March 28 demonstration is a response to an unprecedented period of democratic instability under Donald Trump's presidency. **Among the concerns cited by coalition members:**

- attacks on voting rights and election integrity
- expansion of executive power and weakening of democratic guardrails
- aggressive immigration enforcement operations targeting communities across the country
- the normalization of political extremism and political violence
- growing fears of weakening global stability international escalation following U.S. involvement in the war with Iran

LOCAL DEMANDS

While part of a nationwide day of action, the Detroit mobilization also focuses on issues affecting local communities.

A core demand of the protest is **no ICE raids or federal troops on Detroit's streets**, arguing that militarized federal enforcement and immigration crackdowns threaten community safety and civil liberties.

Participants will also call for the **protection of voting rights, government accountability, and the defense of democratic institutions**, as well as the **impeachment, conviction, and removal of President Donald Trump**, arguing that his regime represents a direct threat to American democracy and the rule of law.

COMMITMENT TO NONVIOLENT CIVIC ENGAGEMENT

No Kings Detroit organizers emphasize that the demonstration is grounded in peaceful, nonviolent civic engagement. Volunteer marshals and safety teams will be present to support the event and help ensure the demonstration remains focused on its core message.



MEDIA FAQs

WHAT IS NO KINGS DETROIT?

No Kings Detroit is a coalition-led demonstration taking place on March 28, 2026, in downtown Detroit. The event will bring together thousands of participants for a rally and march calling for the defense of democratic institutions and opposing the authoritarian actions of the Trump regime.

The demonstration is part of a broader nationwide day of action organized under the No Kings banner.

WHY IS THIS PROTEST HAPPENING NOW?

The demonstration is a direct response to escalating threats to democratic governance during Donald Trump's second presidency. Among organizers' concerns are attacks on voting rights, expanded executive power, aggressive immigration enforcement, growing political extremism, rising international conflict, and the Department of Justice's mishandling and failure to fully investigate and prosecute individuals connected to Jeffrey Epstein.

Organizers are also calling for the impeachment, conviction, and removal of President Donald Trump, citing abuses of executive power and ongoing threats to the rule of law.

WHO IS ORGANIZING THE EVENT?

No Kings Detroit is organized by a coalition of grassroots organizations, community groups, advocacy organizations, and activist networks across Detroit, Southeast Michigan, and beyond.

The coalition includes locally rooted Detroit organizations, statewide advocacy groups operating across Michigan, and national organizations with organizing networks in the region.

IS THE DEMONSTRATION EXPECTED TO BE PEACEFUL?

Yes. Volunteer marshals and safety teams will be present to help maintain a safe environment for participants.

WHY DETROIT?

Detroit has long been a center of civic activism and grassroots organizing. The city's history of labor organizing, civil rights activism, and community organizing makes it a natural gathering point for residents across Southeast Michigan who want to stand up for American democracy and the rule of law.

HOW CAN MEDIA COVER THE EVENT?

Journalists, photographers, videographers, and independent media creators are encouraged to request press credentials through the No Kings Detroit Media Center.

Approved media will receive official No Kings Detroit press passes identifying them as credentialed members of the press during the event.

VISUAL ASSETS

The No Kings Detroit demonstration is expected to provide a range of compelling visuals for photographers, videographers, and broadcast media.

Expected visuals include:

- Large crowds gathering at Grand Circus Park in downtown Detroit
- Protesters marching down Woodward Avenue through the city center
- Handmade signs, banners, and protest art reflecting the themes of the demonstration
- Speakers and organizers addressing the crowd during the rally
- Coalition organizations and community groups marching together
- Detroit skyline and landmark backdrops along the march route

PRESS ACCESS

Credentialed members of the media will receive No Kings Detroit press passes identifying them as authorized press during the event.


MEDIA STAGING
